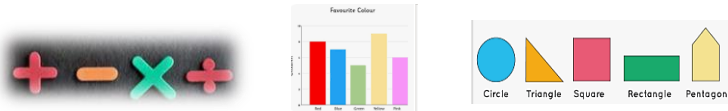


Curriculum Overview

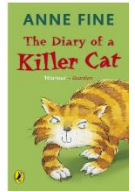
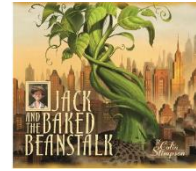
MATHS Addition and Subtraction, Multiplication and Division

In this half term, children will consolidate their learning using the four main operations in a variety of ways, including word problems. Children will also revisit what they have previously learned about money, fractions, time, geometry and statistics.



ENGLISH Jack and the baked bean stalk/Diary of a Killer Cat

This half term in English we will be studying 'Jack and the Baked bean stalk'. The children will develop their oracy skills through Talk for Writing lessons, along with grammar input. They will use the skills they have learned to write character and setting descriptions, a diary entry, a newspaper report and a narrative. In the latter half of the term the children will study 'Diary of a Killer Cat'. From this book they will write a character description, a narrative and a letter.



Geography Antarctica

By the end of the unit, children should be able to locate Antarctica on a map and a globe, make connections to their Spring 2 learning of seasonality (hot and cold places), understand that Antarctica and the Arctic are two different regions, situated on opposite poles of the world and compare physical characteristics of the UK and Antarctica, such as mountains and surrounding bodies of water.



MUSIC Myths and Legends

In this unit, children will develop their understanding of musical language and how timbre, dynamics and tempo affect the mood of a song.



RSE Changes

This half term, the children will be developing an understanding of how changes can occur in their lives and how to cope with them in healthy ways.



DT Making a moving monster

This half term, children will learn how to create a simple moving mechanism, a moving monster toy, by building and using levels, pivots and linkages.



PE Athletics

This half term children will be further developing their athletics skills such as balancing, coordination and speed whilst moving around obstacles.



RE Why do we celebrate births? Part 2

Children will now be familiar with some of the key symbols and beliefs of various religions, including those of a Creator God and the human gift of life. This term, children will be thinking about the symbolism in other religious birth ceremonies, making links with the beliefs and values they have already learnt about as well as considering the similarities and differences to celebrations by those who do not believe in God or follow a religion.



SCIENCE Plants

In this unit children will explore how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants. They will investigate what plants need to grow and will find out and describe how plants need water, light and a suitable temperature to grow and stay healthy. They will carefully observe and sort seeds and will also recognise how some plants are able to grow from bulbs.



COMPUTING Making music

During this unit children will learn how to make music using Purple Mash. By the end of this unit, children will be able to create and upload their own sounds as well as use sounds from a bank of prerecorded sounds to create their own tunes.
